I have had quite a few conversations with our parishioners, wondering about what will happen with the **Christmas Eve** services, with the omicron variant spreading so rapidly. **At this point in time, the services are still scheduled for 4:30 and**

7:00 p.m., with pre-registration required for those attending in-person. The Transition Steering Team has been and continues to monitor health regulations and safety measures to keep us safe during this pandemic. Should anything change, we will get the word out. What I can tell you is that we have very strict protocols in place. We are restricting each service to a maximum of 90 people even though we can sit just under 500. We continue to be cautious. Of course, each of us must make the decision for ourselves whether we chose to attend in person or not. The **good news** is that there will be an on-line service Christmas Eve, no matter what happens. We will celebrate the hope, peace, joy and love of Christ. The angels proclaimed, "Jesus Christ is born!" and we join them in celebrating the incarnation of God into the world.

Worship:

This Sunday, Dec. 19th, is our **Christmas Cantata**, "Winter's Grace" with the St. Paul's and Friends Virtual Choir. A beautiful work of art, this has lovely music and singers and is always a favourite service each year. Worship with us with these special Advent services, either inperson at the church or on-line! Food Donations can be dropped off **Sunday morning** and we will get them to the Salvation Army Food Bank.

Christmas Eve Services – 4:30 and 7:00 p.m.

On Christmas Eve at **4:30 p.m.** we will be having an **All Ages Worship service** with inperson children being part of our pageant. Thank you to our Discovery Kids families who preregistered with Rebecca so that your children can be part of the pageant. Come join with children, animals and all ages as we celebrate the birth of a baby who changed the world.

On **Christmas Eve at 7:00 p.m.** we will have a second service with Lessons, Carols and Candlelight. Our guest singer is Shayla Brown. A quieter service, we hope that it will fill you with the joy of Christmas.

Please note, **everyone, must pre-register for one or the other Christmas Eve service**. We need to know which service you plan to attend and how many people will be with you. Sunday, December 26th will be an on-line Worship service only. There will not be an inperson worship that day.




St. Paul's policy requires that all eligible congregants, volunteers, user groups and visitors be fully vaccinated against Covid-19 and show proof of vaccination before entering the building. Those who wish to claim a Human Rights-Code exemption (such as a medical exemption), should notify the office of their accommodation request and guidance will be provided about how to proceed. Children not eligible for vaccination are welcome to attend! One member of the party will complete contact information for those attending with them. Masking, physical distancing and hand sanitizing is still required and singing will not resume.

We are required by the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit to continue active screening, therefore the COVID screening questionnaire is attached. **Please review it before you attend church on Sunday**, as the ushers will be asking you about your current health status.
