<u>Transition Steering Team (TST) Report: Changes</u> coming as of June 26th

The TST met and reviewed our current policies and directions about Covid-19.

The TST has decided, that, as of June 26, 2022:

- 1. Masking will be optional within the building for all users
- 2. Hand sanitizers will remain available, with everyone expected to use them when entering
- 3. **Tapes restricting seating will be removed from the Sanctuary pews**; people are requested to be considerate of others, maintaining a comfortable distance of three feet from others not in their own party
- 4. **People wearing masks are allowed to sing**; those who are not wearing masks are asked to hum only
- 5. All users will still be expected to sanitize surfaces/bathrooms they use for their meetings, activities, or appointments

The TST proposed the following motion to the Official Board on June 7, 2022, and the Official Board approved it:

That the Board's vaccination policy (September 28, 2021) be terminated as of June 26, 2022.

The TST will reconvene in September 2022 to review the Covid-19 situation before the September Official Board meeting in case any further directions may seem necessary at that time. We wish everyone a safe and healthy summer!

This Week's Minute for Mission



GOD'S MISSION OUR GIFTS Habtamu and his family live in Ethiopia, where Habtamu farms the land he inherited from his father. Unfortunately, when the land was passed on to him, it wasn't fertile. Teams of oxen used for agriculture had eroded the soil, and the harsh sunlight meant that anything planted in it died.

Thanks to a conservation agriculture program supported by the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, a Mission & Service partner, Habtamu and his family learned farming techniques that reduce soil erosion, improve soil fertility, and increase productivity. For example, they are using crop byproducts as a cover for their soil, preventing it from being exposed to sunlight and rainwater. The impact is incredible.

"Earlier, we were hungry and the land was infertile, but now for the last eight years we have been harvesting a good crop. I am happy we are trying to alleviate our problem, change our lives, and feed our children, "explains Yitayish, Habtamu's wife, while he proudly shows a barn full of grain.

"Before, we only had one or two grain stocks. I used to feed my children with maize I bought at the market, but now I can satisfy the needs of my family and supply the market," Habtamu says.
