We want to warn everyone that at this time, we are unsure if we will be able to worship together in person on Christmas Eve due to the extreme storm warnings.

It is being referred to as the "Storm of the Decade". There are two storms hitting our area at once starting sometime on December 22nd. They are predicting from 3-4 feet of snow in the next few days as well as 80-100km winds. There is an advisory not to travel if the storm is bad.

We are worried for your safety. Being stuck in the snow with your car is bad enough but hitting another car and possibly being injured is worse. With such strong winds being predicted there is also the possibility of a power

outage. A decision will be made in the next few days on how we are to proceed. Please check

your email for an update regarding this situation. We will have made the decision by 2:00 p.m. on Saturday December 24th and notify everyone via email if we are going ahead for in-person worship or having to cancel it due to the storm. If we have to cancel we will have last year's Christmas Eve service online so we still have the opportunity to worship from home on this most sacred and holiest of nights.

If we have to cancel and **you know of anyone who does not get our email** but you think that they were planning on coming on the 24th, please give them a call and let the know. That would be greatly appreciated by them and us.

Once again, stay tuned and please check your email December 24th before coming to the church! If we don't see you Christmas Eve, we look forward to worshipping with you in person or online on January 1st, 2023 to welcome in the new year.

A reminder that the office will be closed between Christmas and New Years and will re-open on Tuesday January 3, 2023. There is no Christmas Day service.

Please note that there will be no weekly update between Christmas and New Year. There will be two bulletins distributed however, one for Christmas Eve and the other for January 1st.

After Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the angel have been placed just so, Jesus is finally laid gingerly in the manger. There's always a sacred pause at that moment, the moment when we are reminded that the power of all creation became one with us and

The story of Jesus' birth serves as a reminder that the Spirit speaks to us through the voices of those who are on the

margins—those without power, privilege, and influence.

Through Mission & Service, we as a United Church commit to support those on the margins. Whether in our advocacy work, emergency response, or justice programming, your generosity helps us collectively act in the way of Jesus.
