JESUS IS BORN Luke 2:1-7a read by Peggy Wallace

A reading from the gospel of Luke telling of Mary and Joseph's arrival in Bethlehem.

¹In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶While they were there, they found there was no room at the inn and they were housed in a stable. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger as there was no room for them at the inn.

Reflection Tableau: Mary, Joseph and Jesus Carol: VU #69 "Away in a Manger"

A reading from the gospel of Luke where shepherds are told astonishing new from angels.

⁸In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: ¹¹to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah,[£] the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host,[£] praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"[£]

Reflection Tableau: The Angels

A reading from the gospel of Luke where shepherds go the Bethlehem to find the child

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

WISE ONES COME SEEKING JESUS Matthew 2:1-12 read by Shaun McIntosh Reflection

A reading from the gospel of Matthew where wise ones in the East quest for God's presence in the world.

¹In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi, wise ones[£] from the East came to Jerusalem² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising,[£] and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah[£] was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd[£] my people Israel.'"

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the magi, wise ones[£] and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising,[£] until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped,[£] they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road,
