From the Minister - Growing Together

Sometimes there is no growth without a struggle. The crocus comes up even through the snow at times. I think of those with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) whose lives have been upended with the trauma they've experienced. I have had long conversations in the past with WW2 veterans or members of their family who spoke of the struggle to adapt to the person who came home from the war who was different from the person who left. For some there were years of abuse as they all had to cope with PTSD.

The same is true for our first nations and Metis people who are survivors of the residential school system as well as years of racism. PTSD takes a huge toll on people's lives, for both the individuals who have it and those around them. Add to it the racism and blatant discrimination and life is not easy.

This coming Sunday is a powerful service but not without its struggles, as we remember Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, highlighted with the red dress project. We will have two local Indigenous women share with us their journey of bringing the project to our area and why. Our trees will have red dresses hanging in them once again as we walk in solidarity with them in remembering this very real and ongoing sorrow for all Canadians. It is also one way in which we engage in reconciliation and healing for us all. We invite you to hear their stories, knowing that is part of the teachings of Jesus to be with those who struggle.

This is also communion Sunday, so for those of you are joining us online, please have bread or a cracker and a beverage handy to join us in sharing the Lord's supper.

Sunday, May 14th is Christian Family Sunday, recognizing Mother's Day and expressing appreciation to all who are as mothers and fathers to us, whether they are actual family members or people who are significant in our lives. We would like to encourage you to invite your mother or a significant person in your life to join us for this special service. Just one more way in which we can grow together.

This Week's Minute for Mission



Would you go to jail to proclaim your love? Would you be willing to die?



We are blessed to live in Canada, a country that recognizes the right to love whoever you want regardless of their gender or sex. While we haven't always done what is right, The United Church of Canada now recognizes that all love—including Two Spirit or LGBTQIA+

relationships—is holy and blessed by God. But those rights do not exist in many parts of the world today.

"One of our partners in Kenya has advocated strongly for the human rights of sexual minorities, and that has caused him to be in jail, caused him to risk his life to be able to do that," says the Rev. Michael Blair. The church's first openly gay General Secretary is now helping to advocate for sexual and gender minorities in foreign countries. "When we hear these stories, we can see that this is a life and death matter."

Mission & Service plays a critical role in Blair's efforts. Your gifts help shelter refugees as they escape repressive governments. Same-sex attraction is a crime in 71 countries, and 11 of them have the death penalty.

Mission & Service also holds consultations in other countries to discover how we can best work with our partners to protect sexual and gender minorities. "A few years ago, we hosted a consultation here in Canada with several partners and asked how we can be supportive of their work," Blair says. "They told us we needed to come and help in their context."

To date, Mission & Service has supported consultations in Latin America and the Philippines.

"We are bringing together leaders to explore how the church can be a place of liberation and life for sexual and gender minorities in those communities. That is happening because of the folks who contribute to Mission & Service," says Blair.
