This week kicks off our annual Foodgrains Campaign. Our worship service will once again highlight this organization that the United Church of Canada, with many other denominations, has partnered with to provide food, farming initiatives, micro-loans, and community support to people in many nations. It is a Canadian initiative that has made a huge impact on the lives of many in our world. Please join us for worship and consider if you would like to make a donation. This campaign ends on Nov. 16, 2023. The Official Board has authorized matching with Trust Funds up to \$2,500. Last year, with your donations plus the Trust Fund matching, we raised \$12,755. Our donations are then matched 4:1 by the Canadian Government.

MAID is part of our world now and over the past several years I have spoken to a number of people from our congregation about it. Ecumenical Church Loan Fund: Anert's Story

Fifty-three-year-old Anert Mwenda is a bubbly and cheerful clothing trader in Syokimau, Kenya. Her path from housewife to entrepreneur has been filled with barriers, but with the help of Mission and Service partner Ecumenical Church Loan Fund (ECLOF), her business is flourishing.

After recognizing that her personal savings weren't meeting

the rising needs of her business, Anert turned to a self-help group set up by ECLOF Kenya. While taking training programs on business and entrepreneurship, her business grew alongside her skillset. Today, her business employs three workers.

When her husband passed away after a long illness, Anert and her five children were faced with tremendous hospital debt. The loan from ECLOF Kenya alleviated some financial strain, while her peers and ECLOF's loan officer provided emotional support to help her process her grief.
