## Minister's Message, Sunday, March 9, 2025

**Beyond Sunday: Lenten Stations** 

If you are in person at St. Paul's, you will notice a couple of changes.

The first, is a Lenten activity related to forgiveness. Outside the minister's office is a table with sand and a stylus. You are invited to use that table as a physical meditation on forgiveness anytime you are in the building.

Maybe there is a person that you are angry with. Or perhaps there is a situation that you have been struggling with. Maybe you need to give yourself a break. Whatever it is, you are invited to write out the name or situation in the sand. Breathe. And then wipe the sand and clear it. Actual forgiveness is not so easy. But maybe taking this step: naming it and then imagining letting it go, might be helpful for you as part of your spiritual journey.

The second, is the addition of a table in the sanctuary with candles. On Sunday mornings, you are invited to light a candle as you pray for someone or something. There is a prayer book located on the table, and you are welcome to write your prayer concern in the book. This book will be in a public place so please do not include last names or details. We will reference the book in our prayers of the people.

If you are a part of our online community, please feel encouraged to email or message me before the service and we will light a candle for you and record your request in the book.

#### This Week's Minute for Mission

March 14 is PIE Day, and in church circles it has nothing to do with math. "PIE" is short for



"public, intentional, and explicit"—the standards we hold ourselves to when we seek to live into being affirming, welcoming, and inclusive people and communities.

PIE Day was co-founded by Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble and Affirming Connections. Every year, Affirm United invites the church to celebrate the full inclusion of 2SLGBTQIA+ people in faith communities and beyond. The day also reminds and challenges us to continue widening our welcome to embody love and celebrate

gender and sexual diversity in all its forms. It's critical that we do.

Gender identity and sexual orientation continue to be used to justify serious human rights violations around the world. Same-sex sexual activity is a crime in 71 countries; in 11 of these the death penalty is at least a possibility. Statistics Canada's recently released <u>data on police-reported hate crimes</u> reveals a significant increase in hate crimes targeting individuals based on their sexual orientation. These crimes increased by 69% in 2023, up from 3% in 2020, 70% in 2021 and 16% in 2022. Based on this data, this is an increase of 225% in the past five years (2019–2023).

Your gifts through Mission and Service sustain life-transforming advocacy and education work, including supporting 2SLGBTQIA+ refugees fleeing for their lives and providing community awareness education, human rights programs, and safe spaces.
