
# <u>Minister's Message, Sunday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, 2025</u> Beyond Sunday:

Friends, we are approaching the 100th Anniversary of the United Church of Canada. As we think on our path to the future, lets take a moment to look back. Below is a brief excerpt from the sermon of Rev. Samuel Rose, at the inaugural worship of the United Church of Canada. The style of language may be a bit different than we are used to, but the meaning of the words remains relevant today. Blessings to each on of you. Hope to see you all on June 8 in worship and/or at the picnic!

Excerpt from, "The Cross at the Heart of Life."

"Jesus did not discover the law of the Cross, nor was he the first to practice it, though never before nor since has it been obeyed so perfectly and with such glorious consequences. The law is universal. The grain of wheat that does not die perishes. The life governed by the maxim "safety first" is a lost life. He who is willing to accept salvation selfishly for himself alone has already become a castaway. You and I find ourselves as we seek not our own but the good of others. And this law is binding upon the Christian community as certainly as upon the individual believer. Only insofar as The United Church of Canada owes her birth to obedience to this law, only to that extent that she is loyal to it in the future, may she vindicate her right to live and grow. There is no prayer so fitting to this hour as the humble petition for pardon for whatever of vanity, or self-love, or self-will has mingled with loftier motives in bringing us together as denominations into this new fellowship. There is no sacramental oath so appropriate as the promise by divine grace, as individuals and as a Church, to follow Christ all the way, for, believe me, thus and thus alone shall we find the way of life." Rev. Samuel Rose, June 10, 1925, Centering Prayer is so called because the idea is to become more and more acquainted with God as the centre of your life, as well as more and more authentically who you are meant to be at your personal center. We put up many barriers and walls between our being and how we show up in the world (face to face or online). Sometimes it is almost as if we are playing a character with our name.

# This Week's Minute for Mission

We are blessed to live in Canada, a country that recognizes the right to love whoever you want, regardless of their gender or sex. And while we haven't always done what is right, The United Church of Canada now recognizes that all love—including Two Spirit or LGBTQIA+ relationships—is holy and blessed by God. But those rights do not exist in many parts of the world today.



"One of our partners in Kenya has advocated strongly for the human rights of sexual minorities, and that has caused him to be in jail, caused him to risk his life to be able to do that," says the Rev. Michael Blair. The church's first openly gay General Secretary is now helping to advocate for sexual and gender minorities in foreign countries.

"When we hear these stories, we can see that this is a life and death matter." Your gifts for Mission and Service help shelter refugees as they escape repressive governments. As of May 2024, 64 jurisdictions criminalize private, consensual, same-sex sexual activity, and 12 countries have jurisdictions in which the death penalty is imposed or at least a possibility for private, consensual, same-sex sexual activity.

To date, Mission and Service has supported consultations in Latin America and the Philippines. "We are bringing together leaders to explore how the church can be a place of liberation and life for sexual and gender minorities in those communities. That is happening because of the folks who contribute to Mission and Service," says Blair.

Thank you for helping to protect sexual and gender minorities. You are saving lives and changing views around the world!
