Acknowledgement of the Land

Ahniin, We acknowledge that the land on which St. Paul's United Church is located is the traditional land of the Wendat and Anishinaabe First Nations.

Today, this meeting place is still the home to many Indigenous People from across Turtle Island, including Metis and our neighbours on Christian Island, Beausoleil First Nation. We are grateful to have the opportunity to worship and work on this land. We are all Treaty people. This week, as we honour Remembrance Day, we also acknowledge that yesterday, November 8, was Indigenous Veterans Day. The day is set aside to remember the extraordinary service that Indigenous people have given to Canada. This year, as a recognition of those efforts, the National Defence Clothing and Dress Committee (NDCDC) has approved the wearing of Indigenous-crafted poppies on Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) uniforms during Remembrance Day observances. According to the Department of National Defence: "CAF members are encouraged to source Indigenous poppies from the Indigenous community or Indigenous vendors. The inclusion of Indigenous-crafted poppies is a meaningful evolution of a tradition that has long united Canadians in remembrance. It acknowledges the diverse cultural identities within the CAF and broadens the way we honour those who have served, in a respectful and inclusive way."
