



From the Minister

When I was a child, I still remember to this day the expectation and longing for the arrival of Christmas. In my time there was not an overabundance of toys, but there was still the excitement of Santa coming. Equally exciting was knowing that we would then head over to Grandpa and Grandma's house. Despite being small,

anywhere from 25 to 40 of us would gather for Christmas dinner. We all managed to fit in somehow and laugh and love and celebrate together. It was the highlight of the year and Grandma loved Christmas.

When I was expecting the arrival of my first and then my second child, there was a different kind of anticipation. It was a yearning for new life and a wee one in our lives. I was also filled with the anxiousness of being a new mother and the fear of childbirth itself. It was a time of joy and patient waiting and like Mary, the mother of Jesus, ponderings of the heart.

As I sat years later at my mother's bedside as she lay dying, there was a different kind of waiting and yearning. I longed to hold her and keep her alive and well here in my world, yet I also longed for a peaceful death for her amid her pain and her struggle. I was torn between gratitude to this woman who was so wonderful and important to my life and the overwhelming sense of loss and grief.

Waiting, yearning, longing – all three are part of our life's journey. They are also part of our Advent journey as Christians. While keeping the commercial aspect of Christmas at bay, we seek to create a space that longs for the birth of Jesus Christ again and again in our lives and in our world. It is a reflective waiting that asks questions like, "what difference does Christ make in my life, and in my world?" God incarnate, the mysterious presence of God, not just in Jesus Christ but God in us. The stable door is open to us all to enter into the mystery and presence of the holy, in ways we can never explain but only seek to embrace and live.

On behalf of the congregation, I do invite each and everyone of you to join us in our Advent journey and Christmas celebrations. Invite others to come, and enter into this special time in the Church's year.

We will monitor the advice from public health and resume these important services when our volunteers feel comfortable in doing so.


Office Hours
